NHS England 3 year Medicines Safety Improvement Programme

NHS England is calling on services that have undertaken improvement work on the safer use of time critical medicines.

Specialist Pharmacy Service and the NHSE Medicines Safety Improvement Programme are interested in any quality improvement work you have undertaken whether large or small, in the planning stage or fully implemented, whether it has been successful or stopped due to experiencing challenges.

The team will collect your experience via an informal online interview which takes a maximum of 1 hour, at a time to suit you.

The aim is to draw out real examples of what has worked well and what has not worked so well, with the intention of creating a future national medicines safety improvement programme.
